SUP Companion Meeting

The Society for Ultrastructural Pathology's Companion Meeting at USCAP 2014 in San Diego, CA, will be a joint venture with the Renal Pathology Society. The meeting, scheduled for Sunday, March 2, 2014 from 8:30 a.m. to 12:00 noon, will focus on contributions of electron microscopy to the diagnosis and analysis of disorders that afflict transplant patients. One subset of the talks will survey the pathology of renal transplants, including recurrent and de novo glomerulonephritis, various forms of rejection, and infectious processes. Two additional presentations will address the effects (both deleterious and potentially reparative) of stem cell transplantation on the kidney. An outstanding slate of speakers representing both the SUP and RPS has already been engaged.


